When I read the steps on the wall, I thought it was a joke. I knew that whatever was wrong with all of you weirdos was not the same thing that was wrong with me and that

this program was never going to work for me. Luckily for me, I became a member of a home group that put me into service and 16 years later I am honored and privileged to be elected to serve as the panel 73 Delegate for Area 42.

Sometimes I feel scared, unprepared and not worthy to serve in this position. Then I remember what I tell

All I am is a hopeless alcoholic who was given a second chance at life through the program and the amazing people of Alcoholics Anonymous. That is something I never want to forget or take for granted for as long as I live.

All I can do in this position is to be me and to serve Alcoholics Anonymous to the best of my ability. I

want to say thank you very much to everybody who served on panel 71 and welcome to everyone who will be serving on panel 73. Panel 73 is going to be the best panel in the history of the universe!

Right now is THE MOST WONDERFUL TIME OF YEAR! What time of the year is that you ask? Well it's General Service Conference agenda item time of course!! We will

General Service is life changing. I feel whole because of it. At around four years into this sobriety thing, I became bored. I was young, sober, and a bit restless, irritable, and discontent. I had already served most positions at a group level... except for the treasurer. I had a thing with other people's money.

I had done conferences and dances and bbq's. I chaired meetings in treatment centers and spent my holidays carrying the message in detoxes. I went to diners to drink coffee and smoke cigarettes after meetings and drove all around the state of New Jersey and New York with a car full of newcomers. And yet, something was missing.

One Saturday morning, I followed "Mr. Wonderful, Until He Wasn't" into a GSR Workshop and I was hooked. I felt like I belonged to the club of "I Know

Something You Don't Know" and I loved it! I became the Alternate GSR for my homegroup. My first Agenda Item group conscience was me and I believe four other people, but I gave it my all! I went to my first Assembly and it was completely foreign to me. I went to the microphone to give my group's feedback and I felt so uncomfortable and awkward

"I get excited each rotation because I don't know what it will look like and I don't know what kind of growth will come with it, but I know it'll be an experience!" and wrong and, and, and... Ugh! What a mess! What a confused, vulnerable, glorious mess!!!! I wouldn't have it any other way.

General Service has given me a voice, has given me true

patience, has brought me to right size and boosted me when need be, it has challenged me... oh my goodness, the challenges!!!! So, if you are new, welcome. I hope you enter this phase of your development as open as you can possibly be. You are not alone and won't ever have to be on this weird General Service adventure. Because it is, it's weird.

Message from our Area Finance Committee Chair

Beginning January 1, 2023, through a series of guidelines changes at the Area level as well as at the sub-areas of NAGSC and SAGSC, our three treasuries have been combined into one account. The treasurers and the finance committees of all three entities, along with an ad hoc committee, have all worked diligently to see that this process runs as smoothly as possible. Everyone involved appreciates the patience of our members and we know there are still a lot of questions being asked. Keep those questions coming!! We are developing processes as we go and we need to know what works and what doesn't work with our new systems.

The main thing to remember is that groups will no longer send contributions directly to SAGSC or to NAGSC. Those contributions should now be sent to the same address as used to contribute to Area 42. That does not mean, however that those entities do not still need your contributions. We are still funding our NAGSC and SAGSC elected and appointed positions to Area Assembly and to PRAASA. Those entities



still need group contributions in order to provide services to the members through the standing committees. Contributions to SAGSC and NAGSC can now be combined with contributions to the Area. As an example, if a group has been contributing 50% of its excess 7th tradition to SAGSC or NAGSC, and 25% to Area 42; that group can now contribute once, 75% in one amount to Area 42. The Area treasury will fund your sub-area, NAGSC or SAGSC, through one centralized account.

Please continue to reach out to your treasurers and to the Area 42 Finance Committee members with your questions and shared experience. We want to know how this new accounting is working and how we can improve this important service arm of general service. Our Area 42 basket remains where "money and spirituality mix!"






