Grapevine Representative for my district. Holding the current position of SAGSC Grapevine Chair seems like it was tailor-made for a person who loves the vast amounts of literature that A.A. Grapevine has published, and continues to publish. Not only that, it seems that in the last several years the Grapevine has been one of the most forward-thinking areas of this sober world of Alcoholics Anonymous; with its YouTube, podcasts, audio downloads, and Instagram! The Grapevine is taking the idea of Carrying the Message to a whole new level!

As far as SAGSC Grapevine, we have been fairly active this year! Our Grapevine Team has consistently met virtually the last Tuesday of each month, with anywhere between 5-13 members contributing to the dialogue and offering their enthusiasm! 
